Wildlife Corridor

Riparian areas consist of an important mix of trees, shrubs, and grasses along creeks and rivers. **Amazon Creek** travels all the way to the Fern Ridge Reservoir and creates a long corridor of riparian habitat that connects uplands and wetlands within our watershed. Nearly 85 percent of Oregon's terrestrial wildlife species depend on increasingly rare habitats like this one for at least part of their life cycle.



This trail is home to wildlife of all kinds. You may have the opportunity to view mammals such as river otter, beaver, and deer. Many bird species use the riparian habitat along the creek during the migration and breeding seasons. Watch for herons (above), warblers, Western tanagers, and much more!



Riparian areas are also rich in insect life: aquatic macroinvertebrates, such as dragonfly (above) and caddisfly spend a portion of their life in the stream, while butterflies and native bees can be found nectaring on native plants. Look around — what do you see?
