

Call for Research Participants

Opportunity for Cancer Survivors and Their Caregivers

Do you or a loved one suffer from chemotherapy-induced peripheral neuropathy (CIPN)? If so, you may be eligible to participate in a research study sponsored by the National Cancer Institute. The goal is to help researchers design a mobile app for caregivers that can teach them simple massage techniques to help reduce symptoms of CIPN in cancer survivors at home.

The focus of this study is to design a prototype of the app to be used in a future study of its impact on CIPN. No actual intervention will take place during this initial phase of the research.

Both caregivers and cancer survivors with CIPN are invited to apply. Participants will attend online Zoom meetings to give the researchers input into how the app should be designed in order to be most helpful and usable.

Most will be take part in one-hour focus groups to share their thoughts about the instructional content and how the app can be made most usable and helpful. A few caregivers will be selected for a 90-minute one-on-one meeting to explore a prototype of the app, and give feedback on its usability.

You may be eligible if you are...

- A cancer survivor who has been diagnosed with CIPN, or
- A caregiver of a cancer survivor who has been diagnosed with CIPN
- Over age 18

Compensation...

- Focus group participants receive \$75 for attending a one-hour meeting.
- Caregivers in the 90-minute one-on-one feedback sessions receive \$100.

Please note: only one member of a couple may participate in this phase of the research.
